
Dentons has elected another legacy Salans partner as its new European CEO after a partner vote, seven months after its tripartite merger went live (31 October 2013). Dentons' co-chair of European corporate, head of Central & Eastern Europe (CEE) and Warsaw managing partner Tomasz Dabrowski will take over from Dariusz Oleszczuk as CEO when the latter's term ends at the end of the year.

Oleszczuk will stay at the firm and a spokesperson said he would remain in the core leadership team but would be taking on a more strategic advisory role.

Germany


